





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The Dilemma

Our society has evolved into one that requires instant gratification. Smartphones, Alexa, delivery apps, etc. The animal adoption experience is no different. When potential adopters are walking through a kennel, they are eager to know the most up-to-date information on an animal in the moment.

Most shelters use very antiquated kennel card systems. Historically, these cards were intended to provide information for shelter staff. For example, information such as where that animal was found, its identification number, and if there is any holds was pertinent information for professional staff. Here at the York County SPCA, we used very simple index cards with minimal information and nothing of importance to an adopter. The cards lacked personality, salesmanship, and were not intended to make love connections between people and pets.

We were missing out on a huge opportunity to use kennel cards as a written introduction of the animal to a potential adopter like a dating profile for people. We need to provide eye-catching, current, and positive personality profiles, to showcase the animal in the best light possible. We need to leverage our technology-driven world to appeal to adopters and give them a chance to interact with each animal in a new and innovative way. The goal to address this problem aims to showcase the animal and make a better first impression, allowing people to see them outside of a kennel environment, learn important information about them quickly, decrease length of stay in the shelter, and increase overall adoption rates.

This challenge exists in shelters all over the country.



The Solution


Shelter Scan!

Shelter Scan is a visually appealing interactive kennel card that contains a unique QR code and eye-catching personality traits to help the animal stand out to prospective adopters. The card can be displayed on the outside of a cage like previous kennel cards. When scanned with a smart phone, the QR code will direct an adopter to a predetermined landing page specified by shelter staff.

Each shelter's QR code destination may be customized depending on their digital platform. If a shelter does not have an organizational website, they can still utilize the interactive kennel cards with an outside company landing page such as PetFinder, Adōpets, Facebook, and others.

Adopets, which is a pet adoption management system, helped develop the kennel cards in collaboration with the York County SPCA. In order to utilize the interactive kennel cards, each shelter must create a free account with Adopets since their platform helps power and houses the technology.







But what all the shelter staff and volunteers knew, and what the public couldn't see, was that Sugar was as sweet as her name and she just needed a safe, loving home environment to show it.

Unfortunately, after a year in the shelter, Sugar had still received no adoption interest. We were trying our best to find her perfect adopter when Sugar's journey got detailed. She tore her ACL


At the York County SPCA, we link our QR code to that specific animal's adoption profile on our website. This allows the adopter to view additional photos and videos outside of the kennel environment, a more detailed personality profile, and a very visible "Apply for Adoption" button to click, all while standing in front of the cage!

The top section of the card features the animal's name, your organization's logo, a large photo, basic information, and a very noticeable QR code.



The middle section is an "About Me" area where a profile summary can be included. This has a character count of 500 (approx. 75 words).

Lastly, the bottom section is an area that can display up to 4 pet characteristics.



More about me:



Pet Characteristics are eye-catching icons with a small title below them.

Their purpose is to draw an adopter in to learn more about that animal. The list of available pet characteristics is comprehensive to include fun, whimsical icons, as well as more informational icons depending on the wants of each shelter.

Getting Started

Below we cover the steps needed to create your account and utilize the kennel cards. Please reach out to Adopets' customer service for technical support and any questions.

Visit www.adopets.com, click "Request a Demo", and fill out the short form.

An Adopets representative will reach out to schedule a demo. Adopets will demonstrate how to use their software and discuss what your needs are.

After signing a proposal, onboarding will kick off. Depending on if you choose to utilize any of Adōpet's additional features, onboarding may look a little different. If you are only utilizing the kennel card solution, the process is free and proceeds in the following way:

- a. Adopets creates a unique account for your organization.
- b. A one-hour integration meeting is scheduled where Adopets connects your shelter software and discusses any details specific to your shelter.
- Your account will be enabled, and the kennel card technology activated.

Add pet characteristics by inserting their hashtag (in the form of #characteristicname) to the kennel card memo of your base software.

Adopets will recognize the hashtags and convert them into an icon in the pet characteristic portion of the kennel card. There are potentially other options to add pet characteristics depending on your shelter software, which would require an additional fee. For example, we utilize the attributes section in ShelterLuv and are able to simply click on the relevant characteristic and it will appear on the card.

To print the kennel card, find the desired animal in your Adopets dashboard. Click on the three small dots at the right of their listing and select Kennel Card. There will be three separate options for cards. The Shelter Scan card is labeled "Full Page (Shelter Scan)". This will automatically print as a full 8.5" x 11" paper. If you would like a smaller card, select print two pages per sheet and it will be half the size.



Benefits

Shelter Scan offers a total adoption experience by providing the most useful and flattering impression of an animal. Our solution hinges on an attractive kennel card that encourages adopters to scan a QR code directing them to experience a more positive overview of that animal. We all know that many dogs act up in a kennel environment, so we want to overcome that challenge by helping them make a better impression and show what their actual personality is like outside of the kennel. When a prospective adopter scans the QR code and reviews the pet's personality profile, the chances of a successful adoption outcome increases.

Another benefit is gaining the ability to track QR scans so you can see how many people are utilizing the kennel cards. How to track scans may vary with each shelter depending on where your QR landing page is. For example, at the York County SPCA the QR code links to our website where we track clicks and traffic to pages on our website via Google Analytics. Another benefit is gaining the ability to learn which animals are "less popular". Your communication team can then focus more of your marketing and storytelling on these animals whose length of stay may become a concern.
